### **He gets song contract**

Berklee College of Music graduate Joe Moser of Perkasie recently signed his first song contract with Kult Records.

The electronic dance track "So Alive" is considered "soulful house" by some in the industry. It was composed and produced by Moser and fellow Berklee alumnus Joakin Eskasan and features vocalist Craig Mitchell. The song will be released and played by major-city dance club DJs worldwide.

The Pennridge High School graduate's other accomplishments include film scoring credits on 12 films, ranging from short student films to feature-length

films. Most recently, he was hired by Visionary Age Productions out of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., as a music composer, final sound mix engineer and lead sound editor for its epic feature film "The Seven Swords," which has been accepted into the Palm Beach International Film Festival. Moser also has recently worked with fellow Pennridge graduate and filmmaker Monica Hoge to provide musical score for her short film titled "Ballun."

Moser graduated from Berklee with a dual major in contemporary writing (composing) and production and film scoring. He arranged and conducted for a variety of college showcases, including his commencement concert. It was in tribute to the works of Aretha Franklin and Melissa Etheridge, both of whom were in attendance along with producer Elliot Scheiner and a number of other accomplished individuals in the contemporary music and film worlds. Moser was chosen to arrange and conduct Franklin's "Since You've Been Gone."
